SOCIAL SCIENCES: COURSES

- Social Sciences: Understanding Human Behaviour & Society (SCQF level 5)Entry requirements: Achievement in National 4 and National 5 qualifications or equivalent
- Social Sciences: Perspectives on 21 Century Society and Culture (SCQF level 6)
 Entry requirements: Achievement in a minimum of 3 National 5 qualifications or equivalent
- HND Social Sciences (SCQF level 7 & 8) (Year 2 of the HND runs at Aberdeen City Campus only)
 - Entry to HND requires 2 relevant Highers from humanities based subjects at grade C and above.
- SWAP Access (SCQF level 6) (Offered at Aberdeen City Campus only)
 Entry requirements: No formal qualifications, however, supportive interview is required.
 Applicants must have been out of education for between 3 to 5 years depending on the last level they studied at.
